COMMUNITY PROFILE

Belleville is a city in Ontario situated on the eastern end of Lake Ontario, located at the mouth of the Moira River and on the Bay of Quinte. The city is located between Ottawa and Toronto. Belleville was designed in the High Victorian Gothic style and retains much of its original appearance today. A culturally rich city, highlights include Pinnacle Playhouse, the Empire Theatre, H.R. Frink Outdoor Education Centre, and the Belleville Armoury which is a recognized Federal Heritage building. Belleville is home to the Tyendinaga Cavern and Caves, Zwick Centennial Park, the Vanderwater Conservation Area, two shopping malls, the Shorelines Casino and hosts various annual festivals.
